A Parent's Guide to Title 1 Services

What Is Title 1?

Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) provides financial assistance to states and school districts to meet the needs of educationally at-risk students. The goal of Title I is to provide extra instructional services and activities which support students identified as failing or most at risk of failing the state's challenging performance standards in mathematics, reading, and writing.

Career Success operates what is known as a "school-wide model" for delivering Title 1 services. A school-wide program is a comprehensive reform strategy designed to upgrade the entire educational program in a Title I school; its primary goal is to ensure that all students, particularly those who are low achieving, demonstrate proficient and advanced levels of achievement on State academic achievement standards. This school-wide reform strategy requires that a school:

- Conduct a comprehensive needs assessment;
- Identify and commit to specific goals and strategies that address those needs;
- Create a comprehensive plan; and
- Conduct an annual review of the effectiveness of the school-wide program and revise the plan as necessary.

Program Design

The Title 1 Program focuses on reading, math and/or language arts intervention and is designed to supplement services to students using a variety of models. Title I programs generally offer:

- Smaller classes or special instructional classes
- Additional teachers and/or aides
- Opportunities for professional development for school staff
- Extra time for teaching Title I students the skills they need
- A variety of supplementary teaching methods
- An individualized program for students
- Additional teaching materials which supplement a student's regular instruction

Eligibility Requirements

- Standardized Tests
- Classroom Based Assessments
- Teacher Recommendation
